In a critical step toward addressing Missouri's persistent road safety challenges, DOC DASH has officially joined the MoDOT Safety Planning Committee for 2025-2030. This partnership marks a significant opportunity to tackle the state's troubling safety statistics while positioning DOC DASH as a leader in behavioral change and safer driving education.

A State in Need of Change


Missouri faces an uphill battle when it comes to highway safety. Despite advancements in vehicle technology and infrastructure, changing human behavior remains the greatest opportunity for improvement. A staggering 2017 report by the National Safety Council gave Missouri an "F" grade for road safety, ranking it 49th out of 51 states. The report cited critical shortcomings in:

- Seat belt use
- Child passenger safety
- Distracted driving
- Speeding
- Teen driver education
- Protection for vulnerable road users

The findings underscore a cultural resistance to adopting safer driving practices—an issue that DOC DASH is uniquely equipped to address.

DOC DASH's Protocols to Police Engagement workshops are already making waves in schools, communities, and law enforcement agencies.
