As time passed, I watched as police officers and civilians prematurely lost their lives during police engagements.

One day, I noticed everyone's children were playing outside except for mine. I took my girls to a nearby tennis court and tried to engage them in play, but they resisted. Later that night, my youngest daughter came to me and confessed that they didn't want to play tennis because they saw a police officer and thought they were going to be shot and killed right there on the tennis court. The anger and secret terror in that moment propelled me into action. Equipped with only the vision I was given, I decided to trust it and began the process.

DOC DASH is now a patented communication system, the birth of an industry, and is positioned to become the gold standard for safety. Through this publication, my goal is to educate, inform, and empower readers to not live in fear but to live out loud with purpose. Brighter days are ahead!

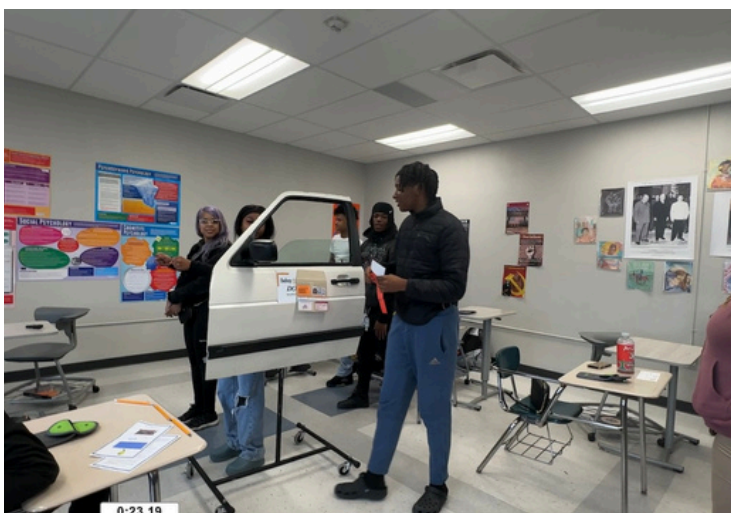
DOUBLES DOC DASH GRANT

The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) has agreed to double their funding for DOC DASH during the 2024-2025 fiscal year, to expand their Protocols to Police Engagement workshops throughout the state of Missouri.

Last fiscal year (2023-2024) DOC DASH was awarded \$30,000 through the Highway Safety and Patrol grant, to facilitate Protocols to Police Engagement Workshops throughout the state of Missouri. Kimberly St. Clair, Inventress and Owner of DOC DASH, met with Mr. Nave, Principal at Normandy high school (Michael Brown's high school) to discuss the workshop's curriculum and its alignment with the Missouri state curriculum standards. Mr. Nave immediately saw the value, made schedule arrangements with his administrators, and within a week, the workshops began. DOC DASH exposed all 631 scholars to the DOC DASH experience and gave all seniors and driving juniors a DOC DASH unit. The impact of the workshops caught the attention of local media and exceeded the expectations of all.

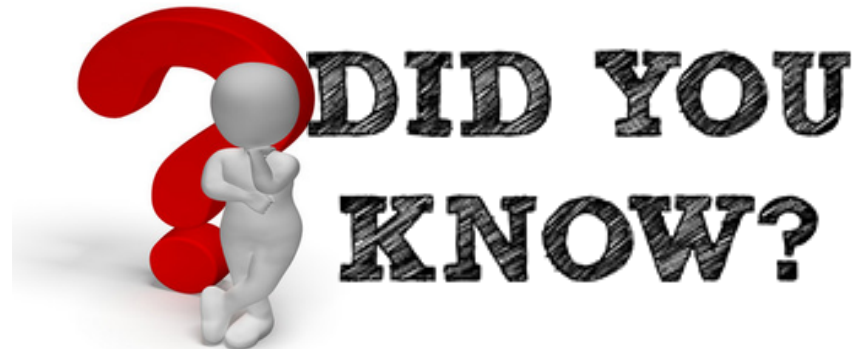

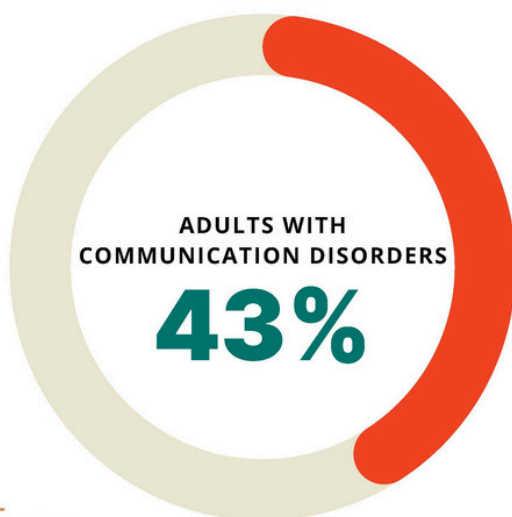
